

- 1. Understand the experiences of children.
- 2. Improve the quality of coordinated and consistent safety planning when children experience risk or harm outside the home.
- 3. Identify children early to build on strengths and build pro-social identity.
  - 4. Ensure we employ evidenceinformed and multi-agency interventions.
- 5. Understand strategic and operational issues affecting children at risk outside their home.

## Appropriate Filtering and Monitoring Definitions 2025

Following a public consultation earlier this year, the UK Safer Internet Centre has now published the updated <u>Appropriate</u> <u>Filtering and Monitoring Definitions for 2025</u>.

These definitions continue to support education settings and providers across the UK in understanding what should be considered 'appropriate' in the context of statutory safeguarding responsibilities particularly in light of evolving technologies and updated government guidance.

## Children's Mental Health Services 2023-24

In her <u>latest report</u>, the Children's Commissioner identifies the increasing demand for children's mental health services and resultant increases in waiting lists.

The report suggests a program of reform, looking to put children at the heart of a shift towards prevention, early intervention and community-based support.
